Marching: Group Solidarity to Keep Us All In-Step

Last year, in my exposition of this Parasha, I asked why the Torah sees its ideal portrayal of the way the Israelites moved about from place to place as a march in precise military formation. My conclusion was that "when all of us move together in groups in lock-step, each man can feel confident that his fellow has his back." Such discipline to be able to move the entire people around in precise military formation is thereby presented as the ideal goal of the Book of Numbers, the Fourth Book of the Torah, and is central to the coloring Numbers gives its interpretation of the goal of the giving of the Law. And conversely, one can say, Numbers sees the lack of such precise military-drill-like cohesion among Israel as the root of all sin, problems, and evil among Israel. In 1:44,

Numbers describes all of the tribes of Israel as if each tribe acted as one man, as if all of Israel consisted of only twelve men. The haftarah goes even further, saying that Judah and Israel will be redeemed when they appoint one head over them all. The opposite of formation marches in lock-step, disunity, is what unravels Israel in Numbers' narrative of the subsequent desert rebellions. Thus the "boring" census descriptions and idealized depictions of marching formations are central to the ethos of the Book of Numbers, for they form a background premise against which Israel's failures to march in lock-step are to be measured. As Josephus wrote, the Jews are supposed to be comparable to the Spartans in their possession of military discipline.

True, there is not one head of the people in Numbers, but rather twelve tribal heads, each with its own banner, and clans under them which functioned as ranks and platoons. The tribal system gave a bit more say in governance to the people, serving as a bulwark against potential monarchic tyranny. Of course, tribal power also could be divisive, and many rebellions and dissensions in Numbers started out as fractures along tribal fault-lines. And the fact that the ranks were arranged by subsidiary clans elevated the status of each. The higher authorities couldn't just "order" clans around the way they could in an army of slaves and mercenaries; they had to respect the pride and rank of each unit. The ideal Israel portrayed in the military formations of Numbers is no general-dominated tyranny, but rather an army of noble freemen whose rights and privileges had to be respected. And yet, ideally, out of their own discipline, respect for God and Law, and their sense of group cohesion, they are able to move in precise formation, in lock-step.

Such voluntary group cohesion, even without a tyrant forcing them, and even without the pressure of having to respond to an enemy, is the true goal of the Torah. But if Israel fails to reach such an ideal level of cohesion and discipline voluntarily through obedience to Torah, the repercussions will be severe. Either we subject ourselves voluntarily to the most severe military-style discipline and drill, banishing every divisiveness in our midst to march precisely in-step as one, or we will suffer the consequences. The evil chastisement we will face from external sources will be but a reflection of our own failures to hold to discipline and keep rank.
